RSL's mission goes far beyond the collection of revenue. The organization firmly believe that true national progress stems from empowered communities, educated youth, protected environments, and strong institutions. Through the Corporate Social Investment (CSI) programme, RSL is proud to contribute meaningfully to the holistic development of the Basotho nation.

RSL's CSI initiatives continue to focus on key pillars including youth entrepreneurship, education, health, environmental stewardship, and community development. Recent milestones include:

RSL, in partnership with BEDCO and Standard Lesotho Bank, continues to address this issue through the Bacha Entrepreneurship Project. This initiative equips young Basotho with the tools to transform their ideas into sustainable businesses.

In September, 50 selected aspiring entrepreneurs received in-depth training in business planning and pitching. From this group, five outstanding finalists will receive a share of M1 million in financial and technical support to bring their ventures to life.

In response to the global climate crisis and local environmental degradation, RSL has taken bold steps to preserve Lesotho's natural heritage. In September 2025, 4,500 trees were planted in Ha Leutsoa, Matsieng, reinforcing our commitment to reforestation and biodiversity conservation.

Supporting Operation Hloekisa Lesotho by adopting and maintaining the Maseru Bridge –Lesotho traffic lights area as part of the national clean-up initiative.

At the 50th Convocation of the National University of Lesotho (NUL), RSL honoured top-performing students with Academic Excellence Awards, reinforcing our belief that knowledge and innovation are the foundations of national development.

In partnership with Hlokomela Banana, RSL has also supported the health and dignity of young girls through the distribution of sanitary towels to 324 learners at Hermitage High School in Qacha's Nek. This initiative addresses menstrual health challenges that often hinder educational progress for young girls.
