

RSL Hosts Central Region Tax and Customs Symposium as District Engagements Conclude

Maseru, Lesotho – 13 February 2026 - Revenue Services Lesotho (RSL) today hosted the Central Region Tax and Customs Symposium at Victory Hall, bringing together key stakeholders from the manufacturing and retail sectors for a day of dialogue and knowledge sharing on tax and customs matters.

The Central Region Symposium marks the final engagement in a nationwide series of district symposiums, which began in the Southern Region, followed by the Northern Region, and concluded with stakeholders from the Central Region. The initiative was designed to strengthen collaboration between RSL and the business community while improving understanding of tax and customs procedures.

Throughout the engagements, participants were taken through detailed presentations on several critical areas affecting businesses and traders. These included the Authorized Economic Operator (AEO) Programme for traders to fast track movement of cargo across the borders, Trade Agreements and Rules of Origin, and Border Procedures and Processes. The sessions aimed to clarify tax and customs regulations while addressing operational challenges faced by businesses in their day-to-day operations.

The symposium provided an interactive platform where participants engaged directly with RSL officials, asking questions and seeking clarity on how the presented information applies to their specific business operations. Many attendees welcomed the initiative, noting that such engagements help simplify tax administration processes and foster a cooperative relationship between the authority and taxpayers.

Opening remarks for the symposium were delivered by the Deputy Commissioner – Priority Client Services Mrs. Reentseng Mosaase, who emphasized the importance of continuous engagement with stakeholders to improve compliance and service delivery. The event concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by the Head of Marketing and Client Education Mr. Letsatsi Sepiriti, acknowledging the participation and valuable contributions of stakeholders throughout the series of regional symposiums.
